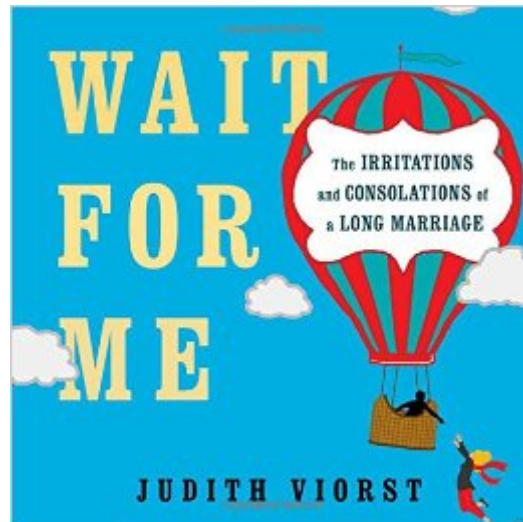

Judith Viorst's books of poetry about life's milestones have long been my gift of choice for friends who are experiencing a significant birthday (It's Hard to be Hip over Thirty through How Did I Get to be Forty, Forever Fifty, Suddenly Sixty, I'm Too Young to be Seventy, and Unexpectedly Eighty). Her latest short book of poems, *Wait for Me and Other Poems about The Irritations and Consolations of a Long Marriage*, looks at another aspect of life, marriage, in a similar vein, and I am delighted to find in it the characteristics that have made her other books so popular: her wit, her way with words, and her insight into people. A nice touch is that each poem is preceded by a quote from sages like Kahlil Gibran, Oscar Wilde, and Gloria Steinem. Viorst writes many kinds

of works: science books, children's books, adult fiction and non-fiction, magazine columns, and even musicals. Always, though, her subject is people, and like any serious scholar, she has endeavored to learn as much as she could about her subject, even going so far as to graduate from the Washington Psychoanalytic Institute. Her knowledge and commitment show---even while I am reacting emotionally to a poem or admiring the use of words, another part of me is so often reacting, "How true; how true". As one might guess from the titles of her books, Viorst's explorations of life are laced with enough humor to provide many smiles, although this volume may have a bit less jocularity than some of her other work (We are talking about marriage, after all.), especially in a poignant poem called The Widow. One feature of Viorst's poetry that I especially enjoy is that, in this era of poetry that strikes many people as more like poetic prose, her poems have a discernible structure .
