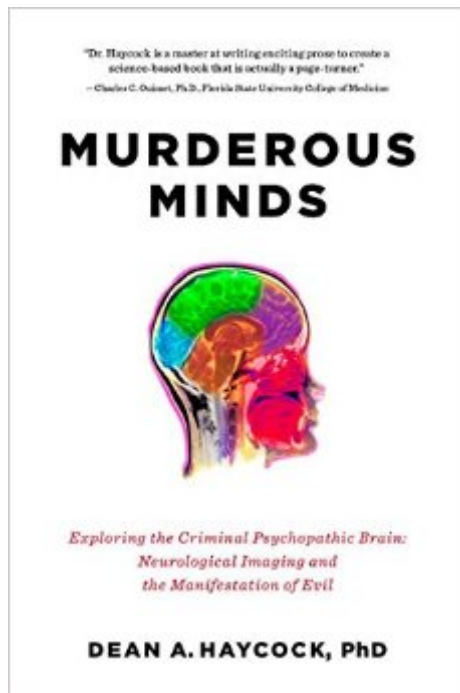

When you think about the murder of John F. Kennedy in 1963, do you ever wonder what went through the mind of his murderer? How about the famous O. J. Simpson, who was never criminally convicted of the murder of his wife but is widely believed to be the murderer? How about Drew

Peterson? He is a man believed to have murdered numerous ex-wives of his. The minds of these men are as hard to read as a book in a completely foreign language. The author of *Murderous Minds*, Dr. Dean A. Haycock, tries to help us understand the many types of people walking around with mental health disorders, specifically focusing on psychopathic people and murderers. Haycock argues that insights in neuroscience research can help us understand how the specific parts of the brain can influence psychopathic behavior, which can also help us understand why some disorder can be misdiagnosed. In this review, I'd like to focus on some very important topics the author mentions consistently throughout the book. Haycock highlights the misuse of particular psychological terms. Haycock illustrates the confusion by focusing on well-known murderers and psychopaths. Finally, Haycock also examines what leads psychologists and doctors to diagnosis people with these disorders. Haycock is very critical of society's misuse of neurological terminology therefore making some definitions important for him to define. The definitions he mentions multiple times are those of psycho, psychopathic, psychopath, and serial killer. According to the Macmillan Dictionary, the word "psycho" refers to a person who behaves in a frightening and/or violent way. However, Haycock argues that people use this term to refer in an offensive manner to someone with a mental illness (Haycock, 12).
