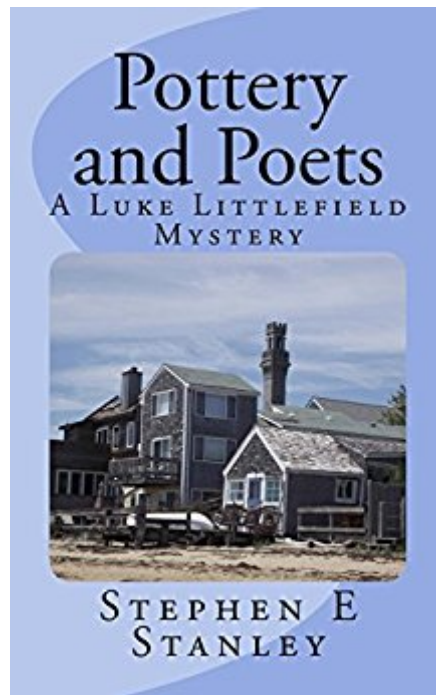

This interesting novel unfolds around several mysteries, both modern and historical. The settings are nicely rendered and the characters are engaging. Sloppy editing unfortunately allows minor spelling and grammatical errors to distract from the text, but the novel remains highly enjoyable.
